IS MY EVENT RACIST? ?

FREEDOM OF SPEECH DOES NOT MEAN FREEDOM FROM CONSEQUENCE

START HERE

Is the event theme supposed to be funny?

- NO: Does the theme represent a culture that is not my own?
 - NO: Does the theme reduce cultural differences to jokes or stereotypes?
 - NO: Do the costumes used have packaging that include the words "traditional," "ethnic," "colonial," "authentic," or "tribal"?
 - NO: You are good to go!
 - YES: Does the event perpetuate stereotypes, misinformation, or historical and cultural inaccuracies?
 - NO: You are good to go!
 - YES: Your event is racist OR insensitive.
 - YES: Is the humor based on making fun of real people, human traits, or culture?
 - NO: You are good to go!
 - YES: Your event is racist OR insensitive.

WHAT IS CULTURAL APPROPRIATION?

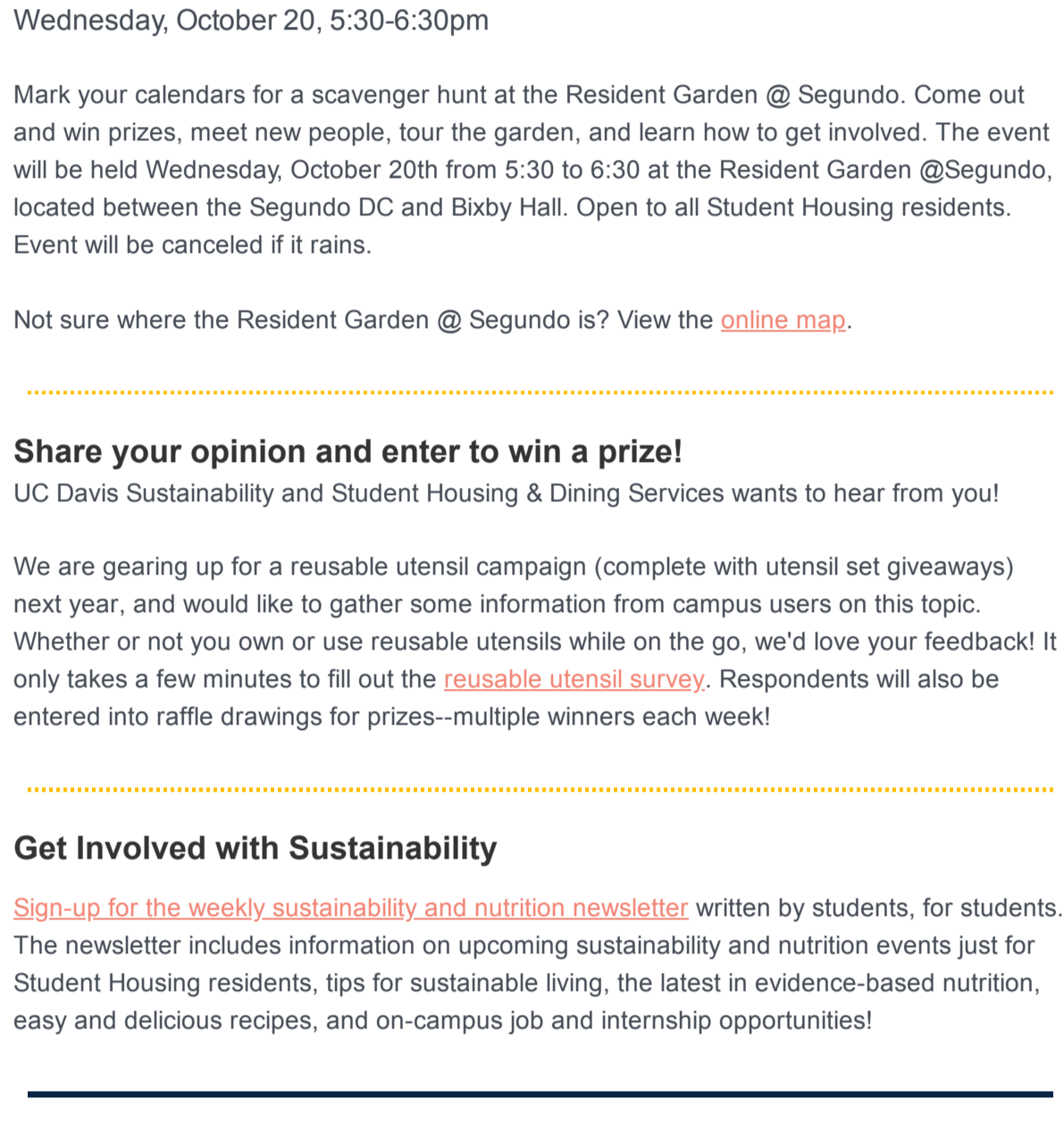
Cultural appropriation involves taking an aspect of another community's culture, art, clothing designs, language, symbols, etc., without recognizing the historical context in which it came from.

Cultural appropriation might also involve stereotyping a community or identity in a way that harmfully impacts that community.



TIPS TO AVOID APPROPRIATION:

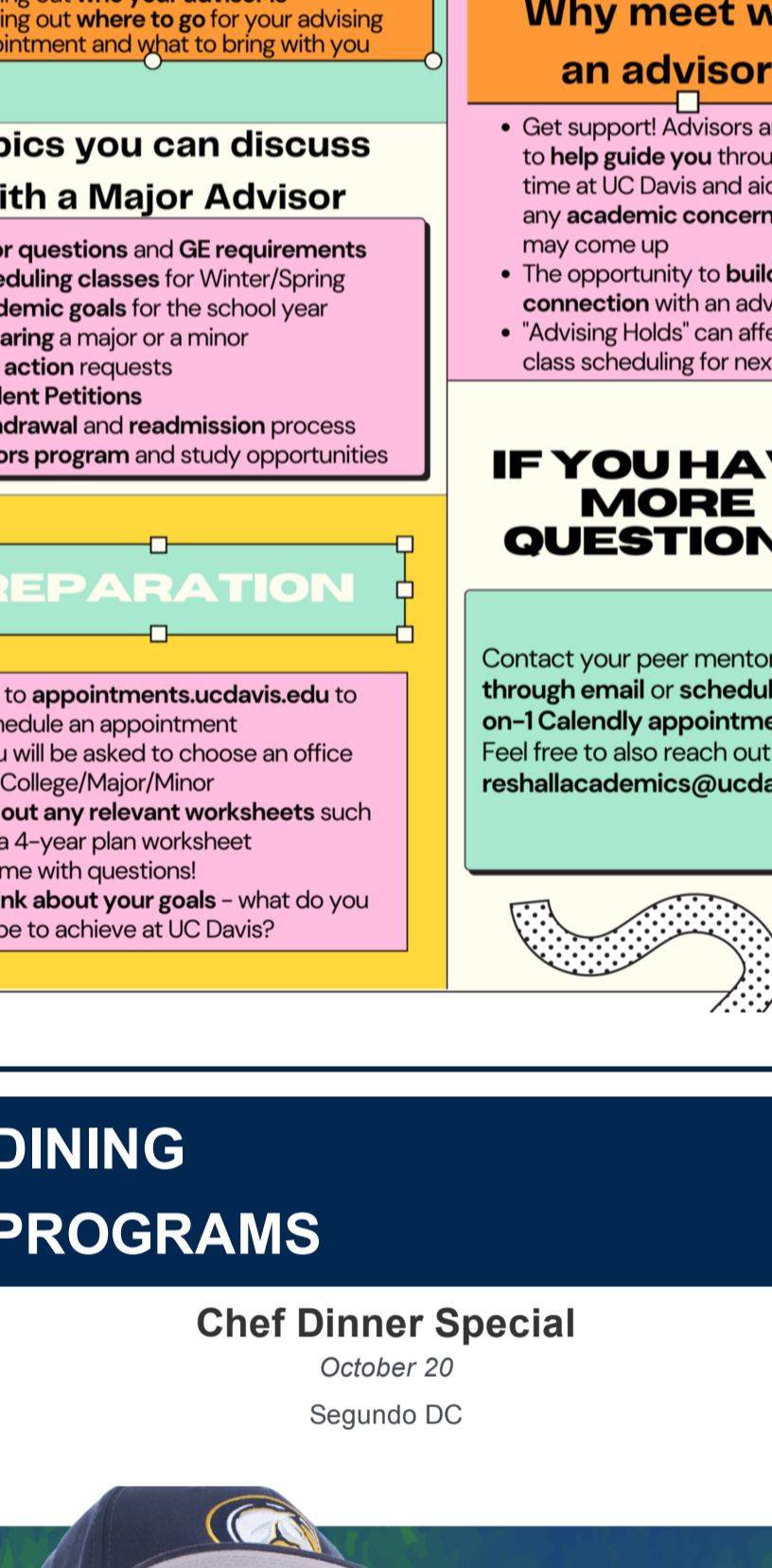
- RECOGNIZE HISTORY:** Wearing costumes that have cultural value to marginalized communities ignores and invalidates their histories and the power dynamics at play.
- FIGHT STEREOTYPES:** Stereotyping a community can perpetuate harmful stigmas and notions that result in discrimination towards members of those communities.
- KNOW WHO PROFITS:** Many companies profit off of people's cultures while authentic products made by actual members of those communities go ignored and not supported.

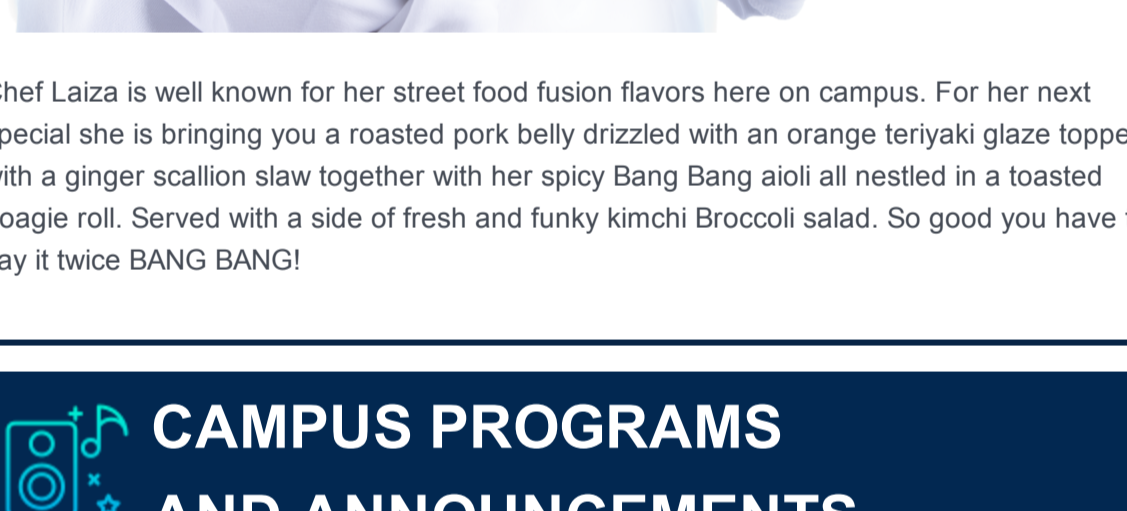

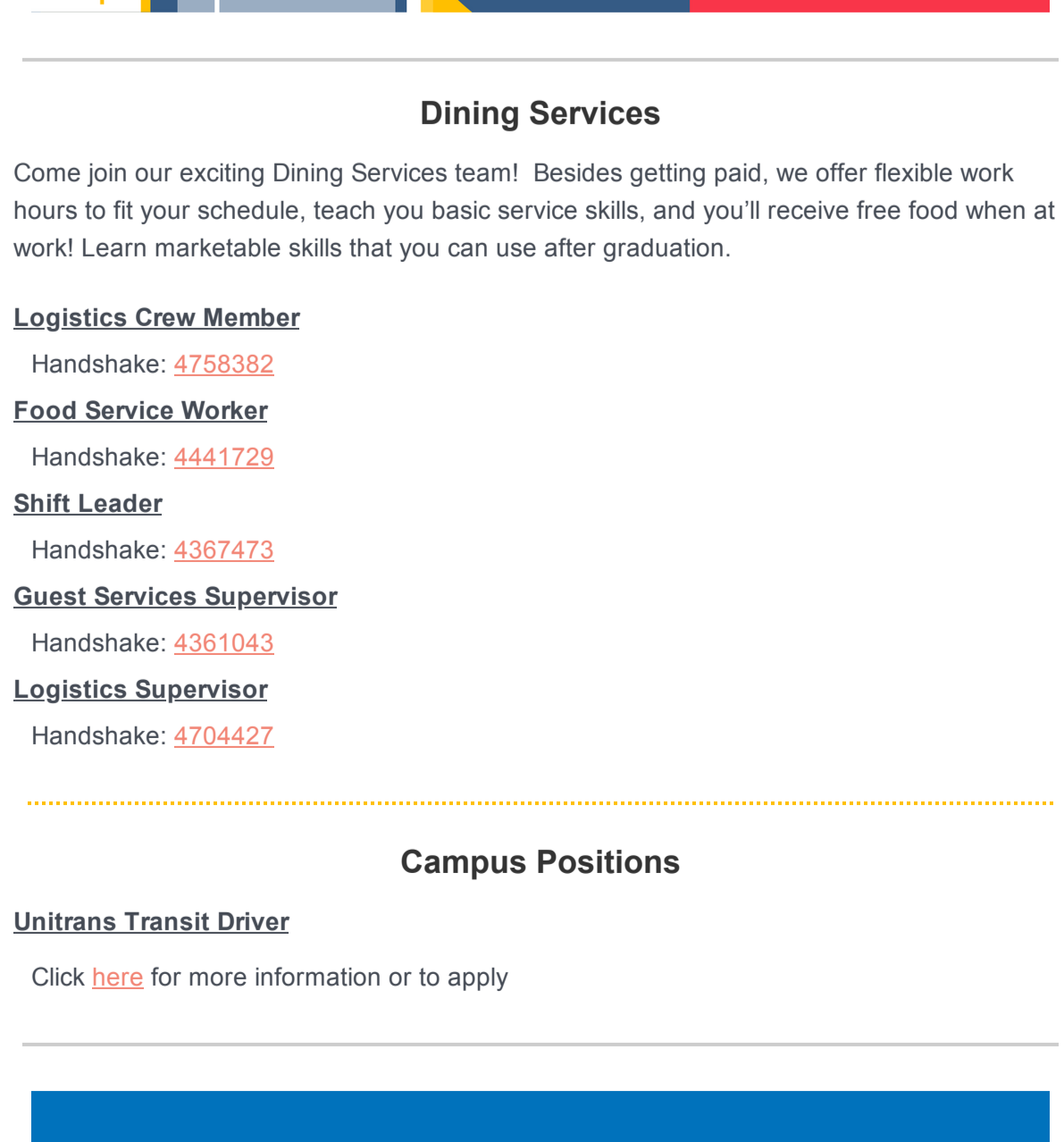
